This was just the beginning of North Central Region sisters experiencing the culture and traditions of our Manitoba sisters.

He challenged us to look at things differently and have a backup plan. We were reminded to remember there are "cat" or "dog" personalities and this will affect how we deal with situations. His key message was to recognize what makes your blood boil. Usually, it is something that is in opposition to your familiar method of functioning in the world. Don't respond but keep your focus. When we are engaged in learning, we need to recognize that not everyone comes from the same background or life experiences. Children learn in the moment, while adults learn through reflection.

Mark encouraged us to use simple instructions, connective stories, repetition and fun to relay our message. This will help us engage and capture students in the learning experience. Simple strategies that engage the student enables the student the ability to cope more effectively with stress. Life sends us messages all the time. Consider what you do with these messages. Sisters were reminded, "Remember that there are children/people out there who are better people because of you." Enthusiasm is contagious, and, as leaders, we need to

emulate this because people will respond.

#### <u>Manitoba Social</u>

Fun, laughter, food, and fellowship were just some of the components of the Manitoba Social. Music was played throughout the event as sisters learned more about the traditions of the social which is used to help raise money for charitable benefits and, prior to a wedding, to help with expenses.



CAN-AM raffle tickets were sold where sisters could buy a sheet of tickets or you could be in the 50/25/25 drawing which consisted of you paying \$5.00 and the number of tickets were determine by the length of your arm. The tickets were all placed in a white bucket and at the end of the social a drawing was held. Half of the money raised went for the regional conference altruistic project, STATUS4, and, if you happen to have your ticket drawn, you received one-fourth of the proceeds collected which was over \$200. Now, that was not all because the Manitoba sisters lead the group in line dancing to a variety of old and classic songs.

#### Learning Sessions

Thirty-four learning sessions took place Wednesday through Friday morning with sisters having the privilege of attending four different sessions of their choice. Rising out of the top of the building is a glass elevator call the Tower of Hope. When the tower is illuminated, it becomes a beacon of enlightenment the goal of the human rights journey.

That is 96% of the chapters in the North Central Region submitting their Altruistic Reports. Our total service hours of volunteerism this year were 191,268 hours. We gave away monetarily \$807,767, other items totaling \$399,489 were given away, and scholarships were awarded for a total of \$133,333. The grand total

## was \$1,340,589.
