
MEMBERSHIP HISTORY LESSON

In this Fraternal Education article, I'm trying to enlighten you on membership changes throughout the years. Alpha Delta Kappa was founded to benefit outstanding women educators with social and professional support. How were members sought out? From information read online and stories shared at conventions, Agnes was the lead recruiter. In her professional travels, she contacted many school district superintendents seeking recommendations for outstanding women educators in their district. Charter members from Mu chapter explained that they were recommended and met with Agnes to charter Mu chapter in 1954. Through bylaws, membership requirements were set. At the time I was initiated in 1973, requirements were an education degree, having completed 3 years of teaching and actively engaged in education. A few years ago, the years of requirement were changed to having completed 2 years and now a member may be recruited in their first year of teaching. For several conventions, the issue of allowing retired teachers to join was debated. Finally, the Executive Council set that retired educators were eligible. All of these strategies were designed to open a wider field of recruitment. Yes, our chapters have still struggled with adding members as some chapters have lapsed. I challenge you to use the wider range of eligibility and work hard to recruit members, especially during the membership campaign coming in January through April. Another interesting subject is that of Protocol. At each spring district, I led an activity of the "ABC's of Protocol." This activity was found on the International website in Fraternity Education. Practices were reviewed and some were brought to new light. "Once a member, always a member," brings to light that former members may be reported as Omega upon their passing. Even if found many years later, they may be reported to Headquarters. Question older members about former members to see if anyone has been missed. I have some in mind for Mu chapter! Happy New year and practice Alpha Delta Kappa every day.
