3 T's – Teamwork – Talent - Time




Pearl Spies is one amazing A Δ K member—a Diamond Sister who will celebrate 68 years in our organization on 12/30/21. She served twice as Illinois State President in two different decades. A past North Central Region International Vice President, Pearl planned and presided at the 1974 North Central Regional Conference in Chicago. She has attended many International conventions and regional conferences over the years. In 1953, Pearl met with our Founder, Agnes Shipman Robertson, in a hotel in Belleville, Illinois. She was a 23-year-old elementary teacher who was employed after only two years of college. She accepted Agnes' invitation and has felt so enriched by her membership.What has she valued the most? The friendships, especially in her own chapter, have been so invaluable, and she has "learned so much" from her sisters. She values "what A Δ K tries to do and has accomplished." She stressed that "we have held pretty steady, but we must continue to change as times change,which is not an easy thing to do."

When asked about her survival through COVID, Pearl said she quarantined at home except for two doctor appointments, "lost some physical strength," had groceries delivered, used a

cleaning service, was checked on by chapter members frequently and received her first Moderna shot on February 4. When asked about life in general, Pearl responded, "I try to always stay upbeat. What else can you do?" She became computer savvy in the early 2000s and is excited to be a part of our 32nd virtual International Convention.

ALPHA DELTA KAPPA EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION AWARD FRATERNITY EDUCATION Please promote the Excellence in Education (EiE) Award at the April, May and June chapter meetings of the odd-numbered year by using the following information. Purposes: This is Alpha Delta Kappa's educator of the biennium award. As an organization that promotes excellence in education, it is an essential program that was designed to recognize members for outstanding contributions in education, to promote the goals and purposes of Alpha Delta Kappa (A Δ K), to increase the visibility of the organization and to offer an additional benefit for being a member. Why should chapter members nominate sisters? Imagine how honored a member would feel to be recognized by her sisters as an exemplary educator. Members that are active educators may also self-nominate. Furthermore, picture how proud the chapter members would be if the nominee is the recipient at the State/Province/Nation (S/P/N) level and goes on to be recognized at the regional level. The regional recipient receives an award of \$500 from the A Δ K Foundation. That regional recipient would then be eligible to receive the highest recognition at the International level which includes a monetary grant of \$5,000 to use for educational purposes. This is a once in a biennium opportunity for recognition!

We will talk more about this at the State Board!

This is due August 31st – so don't let it slip away!

Alpha Delta Kappa Distinguished Program Award (DPA) is designed to recognize chapters with outstanding programs that promote involvement & attendance of members, plus attract the attention of prospective members through creativity and uniqueness. Eligibility: Chapters may submit one program per year. Only programs presented during the most recently completed year are eligible. Deadline: Chapter entries are to be submitted online between August 1 – August 31. Rules: • Entries must be 250 words or less to be considered (this is indicated by the word count provided by Microsoft Word.) • Photographs may be requested, if available. • All entries become the property of Alpha Delta Kappa and may appear on the website and/or in the KAPPAN. The entries will not be returned. Award: Each region's Distinguished Program Award winning entry will be featured in the KAPPAN. If a chapter's entry is selected to be published, pictures will be requested. The top five entries from each region will also be posted on the International Website.
